2023 Report

The situation in Northern Nigeria, remains dire as Christian communities endure violent attacks by Muslim Fulani militants. Over 250 deaths are reported in Mangu alone, with 5,000 Christians displaced and facing starvation. Despite challenges, relief efforts led by Yusuf and volunteers provide aid to 400 families across 6 communities. Additionally, support extends to six orphans in Kaduna, offering education and hope amidst turmoil. Furthermore, 27 pastors receive assistance to reach out to Islamic regions, fostering dialogue and understanding. The Nigeria project with your support continues to bring hope in the Name of Jesus. Here are some highlights from 2023.

Evangelism Outreach

Miango community in Plateau state, Nigeria, endures relentless attacks by Fulani herders claiming Jihad for over two decades. Christians suffer loss of life, property, and faith, resorting to traditional beliefs for protection. Pastors lament dwindling church attendance as people seek alternative spiritual avenues. To address this, the Haske community initiates intervention, screening the Jesus Film in Hausa, engaging over 78 attendees, 17 lives were saved. Outreach to 4 other regions/communities have been conducted. Testimonials reflect profound impact, with individuals rededicating their lives to Christ and seeking forgiveness. They express a renewed understanding of God's love and a desire for continued spiritual growth.

Relief + Hope in Christ for Displaced Communities

Christian communities in Plateau suffer violent attacks by Muslim Fulani, aiming to spread Islam and eliminate non-Muslims. Villages are raided at night, homes burned, and women abducted for forced marriages. By 2022, numerous villages in Niger, Benue, and Plateau states are destroyed, with fertile areas occupied by Fulani. In Mangu, over 250 Christians died, with attacks intensifying towards the local government headquarters. Despite pleas, police and military fail to act. More than 5,000 displaced Christians face starvation and illness in IDP camps. Relief efforts, led by Yusuf and volunteers, provide food and support to 6 communities, but prospects for rehabilitation remain bleak amid ongoing threats.

Mango Situation During our Relief in July

Christian communities on the Plateau have suffered a series of violent attacks due to their Faith. This attack is perpetrated by the Muslim Fulani, who are reportedly soldiers of *Jihad*. They are on a mission to spread Islam and to wipe away non-Muslims in all the Christian-dominated settlements. They strategically uproot Christian communities in the rural areas by attacking them at night, burning their houses, and kidnapping their wives and daughters into forceful marriages. By the end of 2022, many Christian villages in Niger, Benue, and Plateau states have been wrecked and the few villages with either natural resources or fertile grounds are occupied by the Fulani under the watch of the government.

Within three weeks, more than 250 Christians have died within Mangu Local Government and the attacks are getting intense. The Fulani jihadists are advancing to the Local government headquarters. 14 persons were burnt alive a few days in the presence of the police and military who refuse to act claiming that they were not given any order to do so.

More than 5,000 Christians are currently displaced in Mangu and those who settled in the IDP camps have gone without food for days. their barns of food were burnt down, and they cannot go back to their farms. Many are sick and in need of medical aid while others are highly traumatized. There seems to be no hope for any rehabilitation anytime soon as the condition keeps getting worse. The Fulani have even threatened to attack the IDP camps.

Yusuf (July trip to Nigeria) and Volunteers + Visit to other communities that we supported

Purchasing Buckets to put food, purchasing and organizing the food, meeting with key volunteers with skills ranging from clinical psychologist, engineers, pastors, missionaries, and quantity surveyors.





Food was distributed to about 400 families in July + August to 6 communities in Mangu (Mararaban Pushit), Barikin Ladi (Gwol), and those displaced in Jos communities of Army engineer, Janta Mongoro, Farin Gada, Jentan Ande.
